TARGET BENEFICIARIES:

Approximately 7,200 young women and men reached through capacity-building activities, dialogue and implementation of a grant scheme within the thematic areas in selected locations.

WHERE?

In 10 selected local communities across the country: Bosanska Krupa, Doboj, Glamoč, Gornji Vakuf-Uskoplje, Milići, Mostar, Stolac, Teslić, Tuzla, and Zvornik

WHAT ARE WE TRYING TO ACHIEVE?

Building on the achievements of the previous two phases, DFF3 aims to strengthen social cohesion, respect for diversity, and trust to foster a more democratic and peaceful Bosnia and Herzegovina.

HOW?

By promoting social cohesion through inclusive dialogue, youth-led initiatives, and quality education focused on non-violence and peacebuilding; supporting cultural diversity and shared heritage; while collaborating with government institutions to empower youth in community development.

WHO IS INVOLVED?

BiH Signatory: Ministry of Civil Affairs of Bosnia and Herzegovina **Implemented by:** UNDP (lead agency), UNICEF, and UNESCO

Implementing Partners: Entity and Cantonal Ministries of Education and Culture, local governments in selected locations, City of Mostar, Museum of Contemporary Art of the Republika Srpska, National Museum of BiH, Universities of Sarajevo and Banja Luka, schools from selected locations, CSOs.

WHAT HAVE WE ACHIEVED SO FAR?

Established the Steering Board, including also representatives from all three members of the Presidency of BiH, ensuring inclusive governance and oversight.

Developed a comprehensive methodology for the selection of local governments and conducted field visits to finalize the selection of 10 communities.

Initiated the development of an integrative peace education curriculum to promote long-term peacebuilding and social cohesion.

Conducting gender-sensitive mapping of youth bodies and organizations, assessing existing project interventions in BiH (beyond DFF3), identifying gender biases, examining the evolving roles of women and men over the past 30 years, and exploring how societal norms around masculinity and femininity impact communities.
