WHAT ARE WE TRYING TO ACHIEVE?

Develop a roadmap proposing clear steps and approaches that can be taken to address outstanding transitional justice issues and prevent recurrence.

HOW?

An experienced international consultant and national consultant have been engaged to lead this effort. This initiative will outline options for addressing key barriers and opportunities for dialogue, utilizing platforms and networks to enhance awareness and coordination across stakeholders, with a strong emphasis on gender equality and human rights.

WHO IS INVOLVED?

Through a participatory and inclusive approach, a wide range of stakeholders—including government authorities, civil society organizations, survivors, victims' families, and the international community—will be engaged to collaboratively identify key challenges and practical solutions for addressing transitional justice.

WHERE?

Engaging stakeholders at all levels across Bosnia and Herzegovina.

KEY OUTPUTS:

- 1. **Roadmap**: A outline of actionable steps to accelerate progress in transitional justice, focusing on rights-based, victim-centered, and intergenerational approaches to reconciliation.
- **2. Concept Note:** A foundational document to support a potential PBF-funded initiative, aimed at advancing long-term initiatives in transitional justice and reconciliation.
